Serving Deaf & Hard-of-Hearing Audiences

Making your performances and events accessible is more than technology – it's a commitment to inclusion.

Audio & Visual Clarity

- Ensure a well-functioning sound system with clear amplification
- Use wireless or lapel microphones for all performers and speakers (including guests or narrators)
- Reduce background noise during performances where possible
- Provide good lighting and clear sightlines to the stage and actors

Communication Accessibility

- Offer live captioning during performances (on-screen and/or via mobile devices)
- Consider providing ASL interpretation for live events when possible
- Provide captioned recordings of performances and other events online
- Display lyrics, dialogue or narration in real-time with large, readable fonts
- Train ushers and front-of-house staff to communicate respectfully with deaf and hard-of-hearing patrons

Technology & Tools

- Install or ensure strong Wi-Fi connectivity in your venue or streaming area
- Use a supported audio encoder, such as vMix, OBS or Kiloview, to send clean audio to your captioning provider
- Provide a dedicated audio feed or output from your soundboard for optimal captioning input
- Use Verbit or another provider to generate a static RTMP link for recurring live captioning
- Offer QR codes or links that patrons can scan to view captions on their mobile devices
- Make sure your livestreaming platform supports caption overlays or external caption links
- Customize caption display settings (font size, color, background) for visibility and clarity

Set up easy access to bookings and scheduling tools for regular performances and events

Planning & Communication

- Ask patrons about accessibility needs during ticket purchases or event registrations
- Send prep materials (scripts, character names, key themes) to your caption provider ahead of time to improve accuracy
- Clearly communicate that accessibility services are available (in programs, on your website, in pre-show announcements)
- Make sure captions can be easily turned on/off depending on the segment (e.g., performance vs. intermission)

Community & Inclusion

- Invite deaf and hard-of-hearing patrons to share feedback on what works and where improvements can be made
- Offer inclusive social events or talkbacks that are accessible
- Consider accessibility in special performances, galas, premieres and seasonal shows
- Celebrate accessibility milestones and use them as opportunities to educate and build community
